MENTAL HEALTH

FINACIAL STABILITY

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevents (CDC) estimates that 1 in 5 adults experience at least one mental health condition every year.

If left untreated, mental health conditions can result in unnecessary disability, unemployment, substance abuse, homelessness, suicide, and poor quality of life, so it is hard to deny why we, as a community, need to make this a priority.
